

Brookhaven College Immersion Courses

RUSS 1311 Beginning Russian I (3 Credits) (3 Lec., 1 Lab. = 64 Contact Hours)

Prerequisite: None. This is the first semester of academic transfer Russian. It is an introductory course intended for students with little or no knowledge of the language. Its aim is to present essential vocabulary and grammar, and to develop the pronunciation, listening, reading, and writing skills necessary for basic communication and comprehension. Customs and cultural insights are also presented. This course is cross-listed as RUSS 1411 but is used only in Study Abroad programs. Students may register for either RUSS 1311 or RUSS 1411 but may receive credit for only one of the two.

RUSS 1312 Beginning Russian II (3 Credits) (3 Lec., 1 Lab. = 64 Contact Hours)

Prerequisite: RUSS 1311 or the equivalent or demonstrated competence approved by the instructor. This is the second semester of academic transfer Russian. It continues the oral practice, reading, writing, grammar and cultural studies begun in RUSS 1311. Students are expected to acquire a substantial amount of vocabulary and begin to deal with idiomatic language and more advanced syntax. This course is cross-listed as RUSS 1412 but is used only in Study Abroad programs. Students may register for either RUSS 1312 or RUSS 1412 but may receive credit for only one of the two.

RUSS 1411 Beginning Russian I (4 Credits) (3 Lec., 2 Lab. = 80 Contact Hours)

Prerequisite: None. This is the first semester of academic transfer Russian. This course is an introductory course intended for students with little or no knowledge of the language. Its aim is to present essential vocabulary and grammar, and to develop the pronunciation, listening, reading, and writing skills necessary for basic communication and comprehension. Customs and cultural insights are also presented. This course is cross-listed as RUSS 1311, which is used only in Study Abroad programs. Students may register for either RUSS 1311 or RUSS 1411 but may receive credit for only one of the two.

RUSS 1412 Beginning Russian II (4 Credits) (3 Lec., 2 Lab. = 80 Contact Hours)

Prerequisite: RUSS 1411 or the equivalent or demonstrated competence approved by the instructor. This is the second semester of academic transfer Russian. This course continues the oral practice, reading, writing, grammar and cultural studies begun in RUSS 1411. Students are expected to acquire a substantial amount of vocabulary and begin to deal with idiomatic language and more advanced syntax. This course is cross-listed as RUSS 1312, which is used *only* in Study Abroad programs. Students may register for either RUSS 1312 or RUSS 1412 but may receive credit for only one of the two.

RUSS 2311 Intermediate Russian I (3 Credits) (3 Lec. = 48 Contact Hours)

Prerequisite: RUSS 1412 or the equivalent or demonstrated competence approved by the instructor. This is the third semester of academic transfer Russian. This course is designed to further develop students' overall language proficiency and cultural knowledge through more advanced reading, listening, speaking and writing exercises. Grammatical concepts are reviewed and expanded.

RUSS 2312 Intermediate Russian II (3 Credits) (3 Lec. = 48 Contact Hours)

Prerequisite: RUSS 2311 or the equivalent or demonstrated competence approved by the instructor. This is the fourth semester of academic transfer Russian. This course is a continuation of RUSS 2311. The stress is on reading, composition, grammatical complexities, and intense oral practice, with continued studies of the culture.

* Note that **RUSS 1311** and **RUSS 1411** are identical courses, except that the first is a three-credit hour version and the second is a four-credit-hour version. The same applies to **RUSS 1312** and **RUSS 1412**. What this means is that the course content is the same for both the first and second course in each pair; what is different is the number of lab hours (and consequently overall hours) necessary to satisfy course time requirements. ***Because degree requirements and course equivalences vary among universities, students are strongly encouraged to seek advice at their home institutions in order to select courses at Brookhaven College that will transfer most readily.***
