

We offer language immersion, college study abroad, volunteer & internship placements, teenager summer programs, as well as language-based professional development programs for educators, healthcare workers, business and other professionals.

AmeriSpan started in 1993 in a small apartment with only one phone line and one computer. Since 1993, AmeriSpan has grown tremendously sending more than 35,000 people abroad to participate in our programs. We are constantly working to improve our existing programs, add new programs and help you select a program that best fits your needs.

All of our programs are designed around the basic purpose of helping you understand and communicate in another language with different people in a pleasant and fast way. Our 'formula' for accomplishing this consists of three ingredients for your success: Intensive language instruction, cultural immersion and leisure. Many programs such as our volunteer/internship and SALUD programs include a service-learning component as well. With AmeriSpan, you have the opportunity of choosing between different countries, target languages, housing, lifestyles and methods of instruction from our various programs.

Every AmeriSpan staff member has studied and/or lived abroad for extended periods of time. We understand your questions and concerns because we have personally dealt with the same issues. We have gone to great lengths to make it easier for you than it was for us. After enrolling in a program, you will receive a copy of the "Need-To-Know" fact sheets on the country or countries that you will be visiting. These fact sheets include information about entry requirements, climate, health and many other "Need-To-Know" things. If you still have questions, we'll be happy to answer them.

Unbiased Language Travel Specialists

We are neither a language school nor a travel agent —we're a hybrid of the two, a language travel organization. AmeriSpan has evaluated hundreds of schools, host families and destinations to determine which programs to offer. Our independence allows us to give you unbiased evaluations of the programs. We do not just list what is included —rather, we clearly state our opinions. Each program description contains a program review that describes "what we like" and "what we don't like" about the program.

No Headaches, No Hassles

Aside from assisting you with which program to choose, we work hard to make the whole process as simple as possible. AmeriSpan pre-arranges your school, lodging, airport pick-up and other services. With AmeriSpan, you will not have to worry about international wire transfers, international phone calls or dozens of other possible complications with arrangements and money. We accept personal checks, Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express. AmeriSpan accepts applications by mail, by fax or online.

Latin America & Spain Experts

Prior to 1999, AmeriSpan specialized in offering Spanish programs in Latin America and Spain. Our staff has repeatedly traveled to every Spanish-speaking nation in the world (20 different countries) to personally evaluate hundreds of language schools and host families. As a result of this emphasis, our staff has an enormous amount of first-hand knowledge about the Spanish-speaking world.

Emergency Message Service

During an emergency if your family can't contact you, they may call us 24 hours/day, dictate the message and we will relay the message to you. Conversely, if you cannot reach your family and it is an emergency, call us collect from anywhere and we will relay the message.

Making a Difference

Since the beginning, AmeriSpan has been active in "making a difference." Over the years, we have participated in numerous projects including rainforest preservation, literacy projects in Hispanic communities and aiding Latin American health-related organizations.

WHY IMMERSION?

Learning another language is more than memorizing vocabulary and grammatical structure; it's embracing an element which binds together a people ... a way of life ... a culture. You cannot learn these aspects from a book; experience is your only teacher. By totally immersing yourself, you will speed up your comprehension and usage of your target language because you will be living the language. Here are some other reasons to consider total immersion:

- Fewer Distractions & Better Concentration By leaving responsibilities such as job and family at home, you can focus more easily on studying the language.
- Recreation & Relaxation Whether your interests lie in food, art, architecture, history, beaches, outdoor activities or something else, you can find an immersion program that will allow you to pursue those interests while you participate.
- **Around-The-Clock Classroom** Learning extends beyond the class hours because you are surrounded by the classroom. You will constantly be reading, speaking and listening to the foreign language whether eating a meal, shopping, or asking for directions.
- Increasingly Required By Employers Many employers and advanced degree programs require foreign language and international experience.
- Better Value Than US-based Private Institutions Many immersion programs, especially those in Latin America, cost the same or less than US-based classes even after paying for airfare, lodging and meals.

FINDING THE RIGHT PROGRAM

At AmeriSpan, our mission is to assist you in planning and creating a successful language travel trip. Our students range in age from 5 to 80 years old. Everyone seems to have a different reason for going, such as business, adventure, pleasure, or culture. However, people have this goal in common: to gain foreign language skills and international experience. When deciding on a language travel program, you should ask yourself two questions: What type of atmosphere do I want? How long can I study?

Atmosphere

AmeriSpan believes that atmosphere is the key ingredient in the overall learning recipe. If you are comfortable where you are studying, then you will learn. What do you desire? Big cities, small colonial towns, large families, families with no children, private rooms, apartments, dorms, particular food, nature, beaches, ruins, night-life or quiet? AmeriSpan has options in many different cities and countries to insure that you can find the perfect setting to learn and enjoy.

How Long

The golden rule is to stay as many weeks as possible, but not to study too many hours per day. Generally, beginning students can expect to develop moderate fluency in 2-4 months, depending on many factors, including atmosphere, method of instruction, homestay versus hotel, previous preparation in the foreign language, experience with a second language and motivation. Most people learn faster studying 4-6 hours per day versus 8 hours per day because their brains stay fresh. If your brain gets tired, you are going to get confused. Many 8 hr/day students acquaint themselves with many aspects of the language, but never really learn much. If you need to learn fast and only have a few weeks, look for programs that use a variety of teaching techniques. AmeriSpan's Executive Intensive Business/Professional Programs were specially designed to use a variety of techniques to keep the process fresh.



LODGING & MEALS

Most AmeriSpan programs include at least one type of lodging. They usually include meals and are intended for various age groups. For those interested in arranging their own lodging, we do offer classes only and may be able to offer a few hotel recommendations. Below are descriptions of the three types of lodging available at our different programs:

Host Family (some meals)

Nearly all AmeriSpan programs offer you the opportunity to live with a local host family. The families are screened and selected by the AmeriSpan partner school. In addition to receiving room and board, many students form friendships that can last a lifetime. Living with a family provides complete immersion, gives you the opportunity to practice what you've learned and gives you a firsthand look at a different culture.

According to our past participants, the homestay is either the best or worst part of the trip. The difference is in the expectations of our students. The students who have realistic expectations almost always believe the homestay was the best part of the trip. Those who have unrealistic expectations can be disappointed. Remember many of you are coming from one of the richer countries in the world. Few homestays will be equal to the comforts that you may take for granted.

Apartment or Residence (no meals)

At many programs, you have the option of staying at an apartment/school residence shared by other participants. Apartments/school residences vary by location, but generally, have a kitchen, a common room and a washing machine. Normally, your bedroom is shared but may be upgraded to a private bedroom for an extra charge. Most or all of your housemates will be attending the same language program as you. No meals are included and bathrooms are shared with your housemates.

Dorm (some meals)

AmeriSpan can arrange lodging at a dorm if listed as an option in our materials. Mainly in Europe, we offer the option of staying in a dorm shared with participants attending your program and/or local students attending universities. Dorms vary by location, but generally have a cafeteria where some meals are served and some common areas. In addition, many dorms are single sex and have rules regarding visitation, noise, etc. Normally, your bedroom is shared but may be upgraded to a private bedroom for an extra charge. Some meals are included with this option.





FAMILIES, CHILDREN & CHILDCARE

Most AmeriSpan programs are open to families even if some members will not be studying. Group instruction is usually open to children 14 or older. Younger children can be instructed by private tutors. In most cases, AmeriSpan can arrange childcare with your host family, nannies, or at local daycare centers. Some programs offer special developmental childcare programs during the summer months. For teens traveling independently, we offer a number of Teen Programs. ADDITIONAL SCHOOL TYPES

In addition to 1st Choice and Budget-Friendly schools, we offer University Choice or Fun Choice options in some locations. University Choice indicates that you are taking your language at a foreign university as opposed to a private language institute while Fun Choice denotes that we offer this school because of its language and fun programs.





FINANCIAL AID

ACADEMIC CREDIT

If you wish to receive credit for AmeriSpan programs, you have several options:

Your Local University

Many times you can obtain credit for participation in an AmeriSpan program from your local university. This usually involves meeting with faculty from your Study Abroad or Foreign Language department. Sometimes your faculty will request a course syllabus or other information. Just let us know what information you need and we will be happy to assist you. Many of AmeriSpan's partner schools have agreements with colleges and universities, whereby participants can earn academic credit for their language study.

Credit Through Brookhaven College

Receive transferable credit from Brookhaven College, a fully-accredited, comprehensive community college. Students may earn up to 17 credits for language levels: Beginner 1 & 2, Intermediate 1 & 2, and Advanced Spanish Conversation. AmeriSpan offers Brookhaven approved programs in:

Important: To receive credit, students must complete the corresponding number of weeks assuming a minimum of 20 contact hours per week. To receive credit for programs offering less than 20 contact hours per week, you will need to study for longer. The Brookhaven course fees are separate from the AmeriSpan tuition fees for the above-mentioned locations.

Important Notes About Academic Credit:

- It is very important to check with your school to verify that they will accept credit transferred from one of the above institutions.
- It is very important to inform AmeriSpan prior to departing and the language school upon arrival that you seek academic credit.

Transfer Credit from a Foreign University

If you choose a study abroad program at a foreign universities, you will receive an official transcript. All foreign universities that AmeriSpan works with are accredited, and we haven't encountered problems with US universities accepting transfer credit. AmeriSpan works with foreign universities primarily for our College Study Abroad programs but we do offer several language programs at foreign universities. If a language program is offered at a foreign university it is denoted by "University Choice".

CLEP Exams

The College-Level Examination Program® (CLEP) gives you the opportunity to receive college credit for what you already know by earning qualifying scores on any of 34 examinations. Depending on your college's CLEP policy, a satisfactory score on a CLEP exam can earn you from 3 to 12 college credits. The best part is the cost of an exam is less than \$100!

SCHOLARSHIPS

AmeriSpan students are eligible for study abroad scholarships including Benjamin A. Gilman, David L. Boren and Rotary Ambassadorial scholarships. In addition, we offer a variety of AmeriSpan scholarships for our participants attending affiliated universities or for those in financial need. 




From its dazzling beaches to its ancient castles, Spain is a country as diverse as the cultures which have influenced its art, architecture, music and lifestyle. It is a land where cathedrals and castles are interspersed with skyscrapers, where modern rock mixes with flamenco guitar and night clubs compete with cozy "tapas" bars. Spain offers some of the world's most famous museums, resorts and festivals, making it a unique and enchanting destination.

- Figueras The birthplace of the famous surrealist painter, Salvador Dali. Fans of this painter should not miss the Teatre-Museu Dali, a theater and museum.

- **The Alpujarra** A town that hugs a Sierra Nevada mountain. Famous for its white adobe architecture.

- **The Alhambra** One of the wonders of the world, this fascinating Moorish palace is located in Granada.
- Morocco Just 2 hours from Spain across the straits of Gibraltar, this Islamic country provides an exciting taste of exotic foods and markets and an interesting contrast to the European culture of Spain.
- **Avila** A walled city with strong Medieval ambience.
- Segovia Home to an ancient Roman aqueduct, several churches as well as an interesting castle.





Barcelona

Barcelona, a city of 2 million, is literally bursting with art and culture. The colorful and intricate architecture created by the world famous Gaudi, the Gothic Neighborhood and the pedestrian street "Las Ramblas" make this city a traveler and art lover's paradise. Known as Spain's second capital and host of the 1992 summer Olympics, Barcelona is a modern metropolis and cultural mecca. Located on the Mediterranean coast with mountains rising up behind it, Barcelona is the gateway from Spain to the rest of Europe. Both beach and ski resorts are within easy access. We offer two options for Barcelona, 1st Choice and a Budget-Friendly option.

1st Choice School Facilities:

Our 1st Choice school in Barcelona occupies the 3 lower floors of a modern in the heart of Barcelona's vibrant, central L'Eixample District, home to Gaudi's Sagrada Familia cathedral. The school has 55 bright and airy classrooms. The school also offers common areas, including a large interior patio, which looks out through a glass wall onto the school's expansive private garden, complete with trees and terrace. The central interior patio offers comfortable seating and more than 20 computer terminals, making it a great stop for easy and free internet access at our terminals or linking up your own laptop to the school's free Wi-Fi. The patio is a popular spot to relax between classes while enjoying a drink or snack from the vending machines stationed throughout the school. With direct connection from the school to 8 main public buses lines, and a metro station less than 5 minutes from our entrance, getting around Barcelona is easy.

Budget-Friendly School Facilities:

Newly renovated building with 54 classrooms, various terraces, cafeteria, 25 computers for students to use, library and video room. The building is wheelchair accessible and equipped with air conditioning. The school is very centrally located; close to the University (Universitat), only a 10-minute walk from the Plaza de Catalunya. It is 25-minute bus ride to a swimming beach and 1.5 hours to the ski slope La Molina. Capacity is 500 students/day.

There is excellent shopping on wide, tree-lined avenues, and you can stroll along the Explanada, the promenade along the Marina, and have a drink at one of the many terraces that line the promenade. This, combined with the pleasant climate, many festivals, interesting villages and Roman ruins nearby, makes for a destination where you will never get bored!

Cadiz

Cadiz is the most ancient city still standing in Western Europe, with records suggesting that the city was occupied more than 3,000 years ago. It stands on a peninsula jutting out into a bay and is almost entirely surrounded by water. This surprisingly laid-back town with an easy-going atmosphere offers great beaches, sweeping views of the sea and long, palm-lined promenades that complement the lively bars, fantastic museums, bustling commercial activity and beautiful Cathedrals typical of any prized European city. Cadiz looks quite Moorish in appearance and is intriguing with narrow cobbled streets opening onto small squares. Cadiz is also known for its famously wild Carnival celebrations. It has become the liveliest and most dazzling carnival town in mainland Spain, famous for its amusing and creative figurines and satirical song groups.

PLACES TO SEE & THINGS TO DO:

- La Paz The highest capital in the world at 12,000 feet. Shadowed by Mount Illimani's snow capped peaks. As the center of commerce, finance and government, it offers the cultural diversity of a major city & a strong indigenous presence.
- **Tiahuanaco** This ceremonial site (1.5 hrs from La Paz), believed to have been founded 600 BC, may have sustained a population of 20,000. There still are foundations of its structures, stonework, carvings and artifacts.
- **Lake Titicaca** The clear blue waters of the highest navigable inland sea in the world are set off by the dry Altiplano and the breathtaking cordillera. The fascinating islands are known for pre-Columbian ruins, reed boats and the traditional lifestyle of the Aymara people.
- Potosi Near Sucre, it is one of the most important silver mining centers in the world and has the largest and richest population in Latin America. It is an integral part of Bolivian history.









Sucre

Sucre is the beautiful judicial capital located in the Andean highlands. It is known as the "White City of the Americas" due to its numerous colonial buildings, all of which are painted in white and topped with shiny red tile roofs. Set in a valley surrounded by low mountains, Sucre is small (pop. 150,000) so it is very easy to explore on foot. A university town, known as the center of learning and progressive thought within Bolivia, Sucre has museums, a lively central plaza, shops and restaurants. Sucre and its nearby villages have sizable indigenous populations that maintain their customs and colorful dress.

Santiago's city center boasts modern structures, colonial buildings, lively markets, a colorful street scene along with great restaurants and nightlife. Traditional Chilean culture lives on in handicrafts of copperware, jewelry, alpaca woolen articles and more.
- Vina del Mar & Valparaiso Just two hours from Santiago is the 'Garden City' of Vina del Mar on the Pacific coast. You travel through the wine country region to reach Vina del Mar, one of South America's premier beach resorts. Not far away is the bohemian town of Valparaiso, unlike any other Chilean city!
- Vineyards of the Colchagua Valley Most
 of Chile's vineyards are in the Central Valley, where
 Santiago is located. Visits to the boutique vineyards of
 Chile, where you can sample the wines and find great
 meals, make a delightful day-trip from Santiago.
- Isla Negra: Pablo Neruda Museum Chilean poet Pablo Neruda won the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1971. One of his houses still stands on the coastal town of Isla Negra, and is a museum featuring some of his belongings. Nearby, you can also visit the village of Pomaire -- renowned for pottery, sculptures and handicrafts as well as wineries or a visit to the historic Colchagua Museum featuring pre-hispanic art and artifacts from the Chilean colonial period.
- The Chilean Lake District A popular destination with beautiful lakes, forests and snow-capped volcanoes, this area boasts great fishing, sailing and rafting during Chile's summer and skiing during winter.
- Portillo & Valle Nevado Ski Resorts Many of Chile's best ski resorts are only 1-2 hours from Santiago. Portillo is Chile's best-known ski resort where many downhill ski records have been set. Whether visiting in summer or winter, you'll have breathtaking views of Laguna del Inca. Valle Nevado, in the heart of the Andes, is the largest ski resort in the Southern Hemisphere. Amazing views, great skiing, crisp mountain air -- even spotting local wildlife -- are part of this experience year-round. Remember, Chile's winter is during North America's summer!











Santiago

Santiago is beautifully set in a wide plain with the backdrop of the Andes and lots of public gardens sprinkled throughout the city. About 4 million people live in this modern city full of skyscrapers and traffic. 








PLACES TO SEE & THINGS TO DO:

- **Poas Volcano National Park** Located about 1 hour northwest of San Jose, the crater of this 9,000 feet active volcano still smokes and bubbles. Around the volcano in the national park is a cloud forest with an abundance of birds, especially hummingbirds.
- Sarchi Near Poas lies the handicrafts capital of Costa Rica, Sarchi. Many souvenirs made from local hardwoods are produced and on sale in this village. Sarchi is famous for the carreta factories where hand painted oxcarts are still made.
- Monteverde Cloud Forest Reserve The privately owned reserve is located 4 hours west of San Jose. The reserve boasts a magnificent variety of wildlife, with over 400 species of birds, over 100 species of mammals and more than 2,500 varieties of plants.
- Manuel Antonio National Park This popular park's tropical rainforest stretches to lovely Pacific beaches. It is one of the best areas to view migrating marine birds.
- **Tortuguero National Park** This is the most important nesting ground for the green sea turtle in the western Caribbean. A fabulous place to see dozens of turtles lay eggs, turtle eggs hatching and turtles sunning themselves.

- Mosquitia This vast, inaccessible region in northeastern Honduras is inhabited by small groups of Miskito, Paya and Sumo Indians. Travelers are attracted by the pristine wilderness and abundant wildlife, including manatees, monkeys, alligators and fine bird life.



- Valenciana Silver Mine & Church The city hosts one of the most extraordinary churches in Mexico and the intriguing Mummies Museum. The mine was the richest in Mexico for hundreds of years.
- Teotihuacan & Cuicuilco Teotihuacan in the Valley of Mexico was the largest political and religious center of pre-Columbian Mesoamerica. The most important structures are the Pyramid of the Sun (tallest in ancient America) and the Pyramid of the Moon. Cuicuilco is the first home of the people who built Teotihuacan.
- Uruapan Located on the Tarascan Mountain range, Uruapan's cool climate is the perfect setting for camping. Tzararacua is a 100 foot high waterfall that is located just minutes away.
- Paricutin Volcano This volcano erupted for the first time in 1943, completely covering the nearby town, except for the church's steeple. Take a fascinating horseback ride to volcano's base.

- Valley of the Kings These secretive tombs of New Kingdom pharaohs were planned to preserve their mummies and funerary impedimenta for etemity. While most failed the test, their dramatic shafts and murals are truly amazing.





Cairo, Africa's most populated city, has 16 million inhabitants. It may be the world's only city with monuments dating back to four different historical periods- the Pharaonic, the Roman, the Christian and the Islamic. An overwhelmingly exotic mix of ancient and modern worlds, this city offers an incredible array of culture, leisure, shopping and nightlife. All the bounty of the East is here, in particular, the spices, perfumes, gold, silver, carpets, leather work, glass and mashrabiya. The city comes alive at night, which is the best time to shop, eat delicious Middle Eastern cuisine, or simply watch the world go by from a pavement cafe. You can dine in a floating restaurant on the Nile, sample an apple-flavored shisha water pipe at a coffee shop or see Asian dancers and cabarets. Only about 6 miles outside of Cairo are the Sphinx and the Pyramids of Giza.



Why Modern Standard and Colloquial Arabic?

In Arabic, the written form is substantially different from the spoken...to the point that it justifies learning it on its own. FusHa is the formal/written medium of Arabic, rarely spoken but commonly used in literature, historical manuscripts, government documentation, and religious or ceremonial contexts. The two types of FusHa are called Classical and Modern Standard (MSA). Modern Standard Arabic is the most commonly taught form of FusHa.

In general, Arabic courses taught at universities focus on MSA so that students are able to read but not communicate in the language very well. This process is similar to learning Latin and then trying to communicate to Italian speakers. Although you have the basis of the language, it has evolved a lot since the days when it was spoken. The modern language has similarities, but it is just not spoken any more.

Why Egyptian Colloquial Arabic?

Colloquial Egyptian is the most widely understood Arabic dialect in the Middle East and is considered a "lingua franca" - a language that is understood and used across borders" - within the Arab world. Egypt's capital, Cairo, has long been the center of Arab media, films and television programs watched by millions of people across the Arab world. In terms of the number of films produced, Cairo would fall third in line of production after Bollywood (India) and Hollywood (USA). Regardless of the rather dramatic changes in dialect throughout the Arabic speaking countries, Egyptian media has made Egyptian Colloquial Arabic familiar to nearly every household.

Therefore, irrespective of which Arabic speaking destinations you may find yourself in, Egyptian Arabic is a good dialect to begin learning because Arabic speakers around the world will be able to understand you. You may have difficulty understanding their dialect at first, but they will at least be able to understand you. You can adjust your new colloquial Arabic accordingly from that point.



Rabat

Established by the Almohad dynasty in the 12th century, Rabat has been the capital of the Kingdom of Morocco since independence in 1956. This quiet, French-influenced capital is home to Morocco's most important monuments, such as the Royal Palace surrounded by the Andalusian Gardens, the Hassan Mosque which dominates the whole city with its tower and the ruins of Chellah. Its original town, known as the Medina, is complemented by the modern section built by the French. With the city center of Rabat being very compact, all points of interest are within walking distance. With the largest number of restaurants in the country, during Ramadam, the city is quite lively in the evenings. 

Mandarin vs. Cantonese

Cantonese is not spoken in Beijing, yet is still powerful for economic and business reasons. Cantonese sounds harsh, unclear and "uncouth" to Mandarin speakers.

Hong Kong (Cantonese)

Hong Kong primarily consists of Hong Kong Island, Lantau Island, Kowloon Peninsula and the New Territories. 

Throughout the city are timeless scenes from the world's oldest civilization: Taipei is truly a city of many faces, where ancient and modern coexist.

Niagara Falls receives over 20 million visitors each year and is well known as the honeymoon capital of the world.
- The Rocky Mountains Offer breathtaking scenery on a grand scale. Some of the best resorts are in the series of great National Parks which preserve the wildlife and forests of Canada in their virgin state. Those in the north provide basic amenities for tours of the beautiful northern wilderness.
- **Hiking** All the national parks and most of the provincial parks have well marked and well maintained trails. Maps may be obtained from information centres, but those intending to go into the backcountry should obtain the appropriate map from the Canadian Topographical Series. Walkers should not venture into the wilderness areas without ensuring that they are fit and properly equipped.

Downtown Montreal lies between Mont Royal and Old Montreal and is the heart of the business and shopping districts. 




Quebec City

Quebec City, located about 400 km from the Gulf of St. Lawrence, is one of the world's most picturesque cities and is the capital of the province of Quebec. It is the cradle of French culture in Canada with a 95% French-speaking population. Founded in 1608 by Samuel de Champlain, today Greater Quebec City has approximately 500,000 inhabitants.

Quebec City is the only North American city, north of Mexico, to have maintained its fortifications. With its old city walls, the characteristic green copper roofs and fortified Citadel, UNESCO declared the provincial capital a World Heritage site in 1985. The city is split into two levels, Upper Town and Lower Town, which are connected by stone stairways and a municipal lift.

The heart of the 'Upper Town' is Old Town (Vieux Quebec) here its cobblestone streets filled with bars, cafes, restaurants and shaded squares emphasize the European flare. This section of the city demonstrates fine 18th-and 19th-century architecture, notably the Place D'Armes and the first-class hotel Chateau Frontenac. In front of the Château Frontenac is a wide promenade with 310 wooden steps leading up to the Citadel, which affords incredible views across the St. Lawrence River.

Of roman origin, Aix-en-Provence is a small picturesque city known for its rich architectural heritage. 





- Gyeongju This small, provincial town in eastern Korea was the capital of the ancient kingdom of Silla
 and contains outstanding examples of Korean Buddhist art in the form of sculptures, pagodas and the
 remains of temples, tombs, shrines, palaces, pleasure gardens & castles.
- Jeju-do The "Hawaii of South Korea." South Korea's largest island boasts dramatic views, waterfalls, volcanic
 cones & beaches. The spectacular Haenyo dive takes place off the eastern tip of Jeju-do at the foot of a volcanic
 cone. Around 20% of the Jeju earn their living from the sea & in many families the women have been divers for
 generations. Now many of them are in their 70s.
- National Parks South Korea's national parks cover 6.6% of the country and most forms of development are prohibited. The largest mountain park is Jirisan National Park and the largest marine park is Dadohae.


PLACES TO SEE & THINGS TO DO:

- Red Square Red Square separates the area where Russia's current President resides, and its business district Kitai-gorod. Moscow's, and quite possibly Russia's, most famous square, the name is said to refer to the colorful bricks surrounding the Square. There is no connection to Communism, as its history stretches back to Czarist Russia's 15th century pre-communist rule. Then, it was used as a place to purchase food or livestock, while now it serves as a central openair location to celebrate official government events, soak in the spirit of ancient Russia and take photos in front of other neighboring mustsee sites like St. Basil's Cathedral. This has stood on the southern end of the Square since the rule of Ivan the Terrible in the 16th century . You also must visit Lenin's Mausoleum, where the Soviet leader's embalmed body has attracted tourists for years. Rumors say access to the mausoleum may be discontinued in the future so you had better plan to get there soon!
- Trans-Siberian Railway The longest railway in the world was built beginning in 1891 and took 26 years to complete. It serves as a way to connect western cities in European Russia and Russia's capital to its Far Eastern provinces including the important Pacific port of Vladivostok. The six-day trip covers 5,869 miles and eight time zones with other popular routes that connect Moscow to Beijing! It's said to be perfect for travelers who set a week aside to enjoy the lovely scenery like country-side farms to hills, cliffs, bridges, rivers and forests. You also won't miss the 25 million-year-old Lake Baikal, with crystal clear waters that are the deepest in the world!
- **St. Petersburg Boat Tour** With so many sights to see in St. Petersburg, a boat tour is a great way to view many of them. From imperial palaces to gardens, fountains and bridges, an hour-long boat tour on a high-speed "Meteor" by night or day along the Neva River to the Palace at Peterhof or the Valaam Monastery is a relaxing must-do!

It is called the 'Cultural Capital of Russia' and lives up to the title with year-round festivals, like the White Nights festivities at Midsummer.

The St. Petersburg school premises are situated just off Nevsky Prospekt between the Russian Museum, the Mikahilovsky Zamok (built by Pavel I, son of Catherine the Great), the circus and near two very nice parks. The area offers some of the finest examples of St.Petersburg architecture and is close to the Fontanka and Neva rivers. The closest metro station (Nevsky Prospekt/Gostiny Dvor) is a five minute walk away. A wide range of cafés, bars, restaurants and shops are available within walking distance.

Learning Russian abroad in Kiev, Ukraine is one of many language immersion programs offered by AmeriSpan. Visitors to Ukraine, a former part of the Soviet Union, will be delighted to find a country in transition from Soviet Union bureaucracy to a more modern European way of life. Since the revolution in 2004, Ukraine has welcomed a freer press, more open attitude, and an improving economy. This new, emerging national identity has been realized by hosting the Eurovision Song Contest in 2005, being named co-host of the 2012 European Football Championship, and perhaps bidding for the 2018 Winter Olympics.

PLACES TO SEE & THINGS TO DO:

- Odesa Located on the Black Sea, Odesa is Ukraine's largest commercial port. Founded in the late 18th Century by Catherine the Great, European immigrants created a charming, stylish, and cultured city, filled with sunny beaches and nightlife.
- Lviv Known as the "Florence of the East," Lviv is probably the least Soviet city in Ukraine. The city center, deemed a UNESCO World Heritage site, features Neoclassical, Rococo, Baroque, Renaissance, and Gothic architecture. Lviv is easily navigable on foot, filled with exquisite churches, and still largely undiscovered by tourists.
- Crimea and Crimean Mountains Incredible landscape awaits in Crimea: Sheer mountain cliffs meet the beaches of the Black Sea. The Crimean coastline, with its fabulous Mediterranean climate, includes tourist locations such as Yalta, but also intriguing Byzantine cave cities and was once a stop on the Silk Road from China.
- Carpathian Mountains Skiing and hiking abound in the Carpathian Mountains. This range is home to the largest populations of brown bears, wolves, chamois, and lynx in Europe, as well as one third of all of Europe's plant species.
- Vylkovo The "Venice of Ukraine," is known for its navigable canal network, but is much more a sleepy fishing village than the real Venice. Vylkovo is an entrance to the Danube Delta Biosphere Reserve, which straddles Romania and Ukraine, and contains Europe's largest wetlands.





Kiev

Kiev (also spelled Kyiv), the capital and largest city of Ukraine, has a population of about 2.7 million. Set in a naturally beautiful location on the banks of the Dnipro River, in north central Ukraine, the numerous goldendomed cathedrals glitter in the sunlight as you stroll along Khreshchatyk, Kiev's main street. A charming mix of old and new architecture and culture, and excellent food, drink, and nightlife greet travelers, as do the city beaches at Hydropark.

One of the oldest cities in Eastern Europe, Russian and Ukrainian are widely spoken in Kiev, including shops and restaurants. While in Kiev, make sure to see the fascinating Chernobyl Museum, the impressive Motherland Statue and WWII memorials. Another intriguing site is the Percherska Lavra, a cave monestary where priests dug out caves and lived as hermits. You can see mummified monks, and there is still an underground church in use today. Finally, make sure to stop by St. Sophia's Cathedral, one of the oldest remaining churches in Kiev, filled with exquisite mosaics.

Thailand borders Malaysia, Myanmar (Burma), Laos and Cambodia. The east coast lies along the Gulf of Thailand while the west coast joins with the Andaman Sea. Because of its many neighbors, each region has a distinct feel unlike any of the others. With its breathtaking natural beauty and warm and hospitable people, Thailand remains one of the most popular South Asian destinations for tourists. Thailand is divided into 4 natural regions: The mountains and forests of the North; the vast rice fields of the Central Plains; the semi-arid farm lands of the Northeast plateau; and the tropical islands and long coastline of the Southern peninsula. Thailand is the only Southeastern Asian country that was never colonized. You can find remnants of almost 1,000 years of history all through the country.

PLACES TO SEE & THINGS TO DO:

- Wat Phra Keaw & the Emerald Buddha This spectacular temple shares its grounds with Bangkok's Grand Palace, former home of the monarchy. Despite its small size, the Emerald Buddha is the most revered Buddhist image in Thailand.
- Wat Pho Wat Pho is the largest and oldest temple in Bangkok, built over 200 years ago. It now houses one of Thailand's largest Reclining Buddha images and a school of traditional Thai massage.
- Chatuchak Weekend Market The most famous market in Thailand, open Saturday and Sunday, hosts thousands of vendors hawking their wares. Shoppers can find everything here including souvenirs, tribal crafts, trendy clothes, flowers, house wares, textiles, and new family pets.
- **Ayuthaya** This former capital was once the most powerful city in Southeast Asia. The city was later sacked and burned by the Burmese. Now its ruins stand as a symbol of nationalism and religion for Thais. It was named an UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1981.
- Isan The Northeastern region hosts to some of the friendliest people in the country and a variety of interesting sites including Khao Yai National Park, Pimai, Sala Kaew Ku Sculpture Park, and Ban Chiang is the birthplace of Thai civilization.
- Doi Inthanon National Park Located in Chiang Mai Province, the park is home to Thailand's tallest peak. The mountain boasts three impressive waterfalls. The park is also one of the top destinations in Southeast Asia for bird watchers.
- **Andaman Coast** After being hit by the 2006 Tsunami, Thailand's western coast has bounced back and is stronger than ever. Jade waters, sandy beaches, dense jungle, and soaring limestone cliff remain proving the areas natural beauty could not be shaken.











Bangkok

Bangkok is Thailand's most notable city. The capital is the center of business, banking, fashion, and tourism for Thailand and much of Southeast Asia. But beneath the commerce lies a city built on tradition. The heart of Thai society beats through this vibrant and colorful city. Around every corner lies a traditional temple glistening in the sun and monks in saffron robes. Just beyond lie the shiny new shopping complexes and mini-marts. The past and present now live harmoniously in Bangkok under the bright Southeast Asian sun.

Bangkok School Facilities:

Chiang Mai

Thailand's gateway to the country's north was founded in 1296. You can still see the moat that encircled the original city, and there are 300 wats, including Wat Chiang Man (home of the 1800-year-old 10-cm-high Crystal Buddha), Wat Phra Singh (built in the classic northern-Thai style) and Wat Chedi Luang (partially ruined by earthquake, cannon fire and recent restoration efforts). Doi Suthep, topped by one of Thailand's holiest wats, rises 1,676 m to the west of the city providing a dramatic backdrop and, should you venture up, fine views of the city.

Enrollment & Payment

To insure a space at any AmeriSpan program, it is important to register as far in advance from your desired start date as possible, especially for summer programs. Registration consists of:

Registration Process

Within 2-3 weeks of receiving your application, AmeriSpan will send you the "Need-To-Know" country fact sheets and a confirmation letter. The fact sheets contain some tips about things to bring, getting there, climate, cultural differences, money, visas, etc. The confirmation letter will include school particulars, summary of charges, accommodation details, and any other important information.

Your final confirmation is only sent after AmeriSpan receives your full payment and all other necessary information, such as airline arrival particulars. Check these confirmations carefully to make sure that everything is correct. If there is an error, call us immediately. NEVER purchase a non-refundable or non-cancelable airline ticket before you have been confirmed by AmeriSpan.

Refund Policies (excluding Alajuela, Costa Rica & Amman, Jordan)

For those programs not covered as part of AmeriSpan's Triple Guarantee the \$100 registration fee is non-refundable for any reason unless arrangements cannot be made for the dates you wish to attend. You are entitled to a full refund, excluding non-refundable registration fee, when you cancel more than two weeks before your start date. If you cancel with less than 2 weeks notice you will be billed for 25% of the program cost and registration fee.

Once any AmeriSpan program has begun no refund will be issued. If you combine two or more sites to create a multi-country/city program, no money will be refunded once the first program has begun. If you cancel a program due to a personal emergency and you notify AmeriSpan in writing, we will review your claim and may issue a partial refund. For programs in Alajuela, Costa Rica and Amman, Jordan, please refer to our Terms & Conditions, page 98.

Making Changes

You may change your start date at any time. All changes within 2 wks of the scheduled start date are subject to an additional \$50 fee. If you have begun a multi-country/city program, you may NOT cancel or substitute locations but you may be able to change the start dates for a \$50 fee.

Local Holidays

Classes canceled in honor local holidays will not be made up and are not subject to any refund.

Reduction of Hours

At some group programs, if there are not enough other students at your Spanish level, your hours may be reduced. The same amount of material will be covered with private instruction, or 2 to 1 instruction.

Class Hours & Schedules

Classes are scheduled either in the morning, the afternoon, or the morning and the afternoon. AmeriSpan CANNOT guarantee specific scheduling requests. Scheduling is set by each individual partner school and may be affected by the program that you select, your Spanish level and/or the time of year that you are participating.

Organized Activities

Some schools offer complimentary organized activities such as Latin dance classes, movies, lectures and small trips. If the activity is a small trip outside of the school, there might be some minor expenses, such as bus fare and entrance fees. Many students depart for the weekend as soon as class is completed on Friday. Few, if any, schools offer activities on Fridays because of this reason. Sister Campuses

Textbooks & Materials

Each school handles this differently and policies change frequently. At some programs you will be required to purchase all your books. At other programs you are not required to purchase the books but may be required to make a deposit that will be refunded when the textbook is returned. In some cases, participants studying for a month or longer may finish their first book and need to buy an additional book on site.

Deposits & On-Site Charges

The return trip will be at the expense of the participant or the participant's family.

AmeriSpan's Language Levels vs. CEF Levels

AmeriSpan's language levels are different than CEFs language levels. AmeriSpan's Levels are based on ACTFL's OPI (Oral Proficiency Interview) as most language immersion programs are focused on developing Speaking & Listening skills. The CEF (Common European Framework) Levels were developed by the Council of Europe in order to try and set clear, attainable standards at different levels of language learning for European languages. CEF's scale incorporates reading, writing, speaking and listening skills, and are used by universities, corporations and other organizations when evaluating foreign applicants. Low Beginner (CEF level: A1)

No real functional ability in the language. Speech is characterized by a few memorized words or phrases. Unable to handle a typical "survival situation". Utterances rarely consist of more than two or three words with frequent long pauses. Understanding limited to occasional words, cognates, and short slowly spoken utterances. No practical communicative writing skills.

IN OTHER WORDS: You know a few words and phrases, but would not be able to hold a basic survival situation type conversation (ordering food, asking for bus information, getting a hotel room price, etc.). You have no writing skills in the language, but can recognize some written words.

Mid Beginner (CEF level: A1)

Speaking ability still limited to memorized words and phrases, although quantity is increased. Vocabulary is limited to expressing very basic needs and courtesies. Utterances are limited to a few words at a time with frequent pauses. Can understand simple commonly used phrases and questions. Requires native speaker to speak slowly and often repeat phrase before comprehension is achieved. IN OTHER WORDS: You can introduce yourself and ask someone's name. You can ask and answer the questions, "How are you? Where are you from?". You can handle some basic survival situations such as ordering a meal. You know the alphabet and some numbers.

High Beginner (CEF level: A2)

Limited to simple conversation dealing with common everyday themes. Ability to operate in only a very limited capacity with difficulty constructing sentences properly in the present tense. Can ask and answer questions based on memorized utterances. Vocabulary is sufficient only for handing simple, elementary needs and expressing basic courtesies. Frequent repetition and slower speech is required for comprehension. Can read standardized messages, phrases, expressions, schedules, menus, and signs. Can supply information on simple forms and documents.

IN OTHER WORDS: You can have a basic conversation in the present tense. You can handle a basic survival situation such as making hotel reservations. Your speech is slow with frequent pauses. You can understand what is said if it is said slowly and repeated a few times. You can ask and tell time and the date. You can ask basic what and when questions. You can use possessive adjectives. You can talk about the weather. You are aware of when to use formal and informal 2nd person. You still sometimes require slow and repeated speech in order to understand what is being said.



Low Intermediate (CEF level: A2)

Able to handle successfully only a limited number of interactive, task-oriented, and social situations. Capable of using simple structures and a general, limited vocabulary. Speaks with general ease in the present tense and can give simple commands. Can get by in restaurants, banks, asking directions, and discussing familiar topics. Can initiate and respond to simple statements. Able to understand sentence length utterances. Misunderstandings frequently arise but with repetition and slower speech can understand and be understood. Able to understand main ideas or some facts from simple texts. Capable of writing short messages.

IN OTHER WORDS: You feel comfortable speaking in the present tense. Your vocabulary is extended to include such topics as clothing, colors, foods, recreational activities, professions. You can express likes and dislikes. You can ask and understand directions. You can talk about clothing. Ask about cost. For Spanish, you are familiar with when to use "ser" and "estar". You know some irregular verbs like "tener" and "dar". You can use expressions with "tener".

Mid Intermediate (CEF level: B1)

Able to handle basic communicative tasks and social situations. Can ask and answer questions and participate in simple conversations on topics beyond basic needs such as leisure activities and personal history. Sentence length is increased, but still characterized by frequent pauses. Can understand sentence length utterances in face to face conversation as well as over the phone.

IN OTHER WORDS: You can identify most places in a town and give directions to them. You can request information, express opinions. Can ask and tell where someone is going, how they are getting there, what they will do and when. You have limited use of simple future tense and present progressive tenses.

High Intermediate (CEF level: B1)

Can understand and use tenses such as the simple present, present progressive, preterit and simple future. Have knowledge of the subjunctive in a limited capacity. Can talk easily about self and others. Ability to converse on topics beyond immediate needs such as personal history, leisure interests and work. Has frequent errors in grammar and vocabulary but uses more irregular verbs and has increased vocabulary.

IN OTHER WORDS: You can express surprise, emotion, certainty, and doubt. You can say what one can and can't do. You can give reasons for something. You can hold a telephone conversation. Can discuss simple health problems. You can ask and tell how long something lasts. You feel comfortable in most conversational contexts, but are still limited in how well you can express yourself.

Low Advanced (CEF: B2) Mid Advanced (CEF: C1) High Advanced/Superior (CEF: C2)

Rate yourself according to your skill in performing the following tasks: Ability to speak the language with sufficient structural accuracy and vocabulary to participate effectively in most formal and informal contexts. Can handle unknown topics and situations, give supported opinions, hypothesize, provide complicated explanations, and can describe in detail with a great deal of precision any practical, social, professional, or abstract topic. Ability to use all tenses and usual idioms.
