

Learning takes place whether eating a meal, watching local TV, visiting a museum, or participating in an activity or excursion.

We have arranged programs as short as a week and as long as a semester. During an emergency if your family can't contact you, they may call us 24 hours a day, dictate the message and we will relay the message to you. Conversely, if you cannot reach your family and it is an emergency, call us collect from anywhere and we will relay the message.

LEADER F.A.Q.

What are the benefits of traveling as a group?

By forming a group, AmeriSpan is able to customize excursions and activities to meet the specific requirements of your group's participants. We will happily arrange airfare and other services that are unavailable to individual participants.

How do I build a group?

The key is to start early. Decide where you want to go, what you want to do and when. AmeriSpan will calculate the cost and give you a group itinerary. Then it is up to you to get the word out anywhere where you think people will be interested. Upon request, AmeriSpan will list your group on our website so people around the world can join your group as well.

How many people make up a group?

AmeriSpan considers any 5 or more people who register and travel together in any existing program a group. AmeriSpan requests at least 8 students for ready made and custom programs. If 3 students register together for an existing SALUD program, they are eligible for the mini-group discount.

How and when do I register my group?

First, make sure all prospective participants have an application form prior to the due date you have selected. Please send all group application forms to AmeriSpan together. Registration consists of submitting a completed application for each participant and the non-refundable registration fee. To insure space in an AmeriSpan Group Program, it is important to register as far in advance from your desired start date as possible. Four months prior to departure is the recommended minimum.

What do parents need to know?

It is important that you share as much information as you have with parents. It helps them feel at ease with sending their child to a foreign country. Provide parents with their child's program confirmation, host family details, country fact sheets, permission forms, and any other sheets provided my AmeriSpan. The more parents know up front, the less time you will spend answering questions.

When are the fees and payments due?

When registering your group, each participant must pay the nonrefundable registration fee. The final payment is due to AmeriSpan no later than 6 weeks before your program start date. If AmeriSpan is arranging you airfare, that portion of the fee may need to be paid 8-10 weeks in advance due to airline regulations.



When are classes scheduled?

Each school has its own schedule for class times. Most offer sessions in the morning and the afternoon, especially in the summer months. In open groups, class schedules are given on site, based on the results of the students' placement tests. For a small fee, some schools will guarantee your group a specific time.

How will my students' classes be determined?

Unless a student is a total beginner, a written test is given the first day at school. This allows us to evaluate participants' language skills and helps place them in the correct classes. Some schools also conduct an oral exam for a more thorough assessment.

How are host families chosen?

Each host family is selected by the school after completing a rigorous application process. This is similar to a job interview. The family must meet the school's high standard before they can accept students into their homes and they must agree to all of the school's rules and guidelines. Each family is required to provide students with basic necessities including a bed with the appropriate lines, pillows, a desk with a lamp, clean drinking water, all meals provided with the program, and of course plenty of interaction. Keep in mind, most host families provide students with more than the minimum required. Periodic visits are made to the home to ensure things are kept at a suitable level.

Can I have different lodging than my students?

Yes, leaders can choose any lodging option that is available in his/ her program location. In additional to homestays, many locations also offer apartment or residence options. If you prefer a hotel, we can check availability upon request.

What about language classes for me?

As a leader, you may feel you do not want or need language classes and that is ok with AmeriSpan. We can easily include you in accommodation and activities without classes. Many schools can handle advanced levels in group classes or we can arrange private lessons or special topic classes where available.

What do I do if there is an emergency?

AmeriSpan offers a 24 hour Emergency Message Service. If you cannot reach home and it is an emergency, call us from anywhere and we will relay the message to your family and/or your participants' families. Conversely, if a family can't contact someone during an emergency back home, they may call us 24 hours a day, dictate the message and we will relay the message to the participant.

What do I do if my school administration has questions?

AmeriSpan wants every party involved to feel comfortable with your experience abroad. We are happy to provide any materials (syllabus, photos, etc) the administration requests and are willing to speak directly with them if necessary.

What documents are needed for travel?

All participants will need a valid passport and some will need a visa for entry. In addition, some countries require a notarized letter from parents granting permission for the child to travel outside the country. Requirements change often so it is best to contact the country's embassy or consulate and find out exactly what is needed. Sample forms are available from AmeriSpan.





PARTICIPANT F.A.Q.

How will I contact my friends and family back home?

AmeriSpan recommends that you bring a pre-paid phone card with you or a cell phone that works overseas. You may not make phone calls from your homestays, however your parents may call you there. Most schools have on-site access to the Internet for student use and many towns have Internet cafes too.

What should I pack?

Our advice is to pack light. You will be responsible for carrying your own luggage on and off the airplane and to and from your homestay. For specific country packing lists, consult your 'Need-to-Know' sheets.

Am I just in class all day?

No! You have some language classes, but all the programs offer many activities and excursions. Your itinerary is the best guideline of your daily activities.

Is there homework?

Each program is different. Some require homework while others have no homework. However, the term "homework" is used loosely and might not mean lots of handwritten exercises. For example, your homework might be for you to watch a specific TV show, interview a member of your host family, or read an article in the local paper. Your leader may also add assignments for you to complete about the activities and excursions you participated in.

Will I be speaking the target language 24/7?

You will be surrounded by your target language, but will likely have the opportunity to speak English as well. Just remember that you can really build your language skills by practicing at every opportunity; so take advantage of being in another country and use your target language whenever possible.

Can I stay out late? Or leave the program to travel on my own?

For teenage participants, AmeriSpan and the group's leader will discuss rules and a curfew for the group. No exceptions are made, even at the request of your parents. AmeriSpan does not tolerate teenage participants skipping school, missing scheduled activities, breaking curfew, drinking alcohol, using drugs or engaging in sexual activities. Breaking the rules will result in your expulsion and early departure at the cost of your family.

What are the accommodations like?

Many group leaders choose homestay accommodations for their group because it is the best way to get to know the culture and language of your host country and see what daily life is like. Host families will speak to you in the target language, helping you practice the skills in an authentic context. The families must live within a reasonable distance from school, have ample living space, live in a clean, safe, comfortable environment, and enjoy hosting international students.

What types of meals are served?

Your host family will serve you meals customary to your host country. It is best to go into it with an open mind, knowing that you will be experiencing something new and different. Most host families are able to accommodate food allergies and preferences with advance notice.

Can I change host families before or while on the program?

If you are having a problem or feel uncomfortable in your host family, let your leader or the school's homestay coordinator know immediately. They will help you try and resolve your problem. If the best solution is to switch to a new family and there is another family available, the homestay coordinator will help you do so. Remember, the sooner you speak up, the sooner your problem can be solved.

PARENT F.A.Q.

How are host families chosen?

The school selects each host family after completing a rigorous application process. A family must meet the school's high standards before they can accept students into their homes and they must agree to all of the school's rules and guidelines. Each family is required to provide students with basic necessities. Keep in mind, most host families provide students with more than the minimum required. Periodic visits are made to the homes to ensure things are kept at a suitable level.

How will I know my child has arrived safely?

For group programs, AmeriSpan recommends that leaders set up a phone chain using the students' at-home contacts for the quickest way to keep everyone informed. Keep in mind that flights are rarely on time, immigration lines are usually long and the group needs to get from the airport to their lodging. These factors may cause a delay with the group's leader communicating with you.

How can I communicate with my child? And vice versa?

The best way to keep in touch is to purchase a pre-paid phone card or a cell phone that works overseas. Participants may not make phone calls from their homestays, however parents may call the participants at the homestay. Most program locations have access to the Internet as well.

If we apply & change our minds, can we get our money back?

The registration fee for Group Programs in non-refundable. You are entitled to a full refund (excluding registration fee) when you cancel more than 8 weeks before your start date. If you cancel within 4 - 8weeks notice, you will be billed for 25% of the program cost and the registration fee. If you cancel less than 4 weeks before the program start date, THERE ARE NO REFUNDS. There are also no refunds once the program begins. Airfare arranged by AmeriSpan is non-refundable.

What type of spending money should my child bring?

We recommend a combination of debit/credit card, cash and travelers checks. In most program locations, there are ATM machines. Although traveler's checks can be more difficult to use, we still recommend some just in case your child loses their purse or wallet. Your child will be responsible for any meals not included in the program, as well as snacks, souvenirs, drinks etc. Transportation to/from school and during his/her free time is not included in the program cost. For most countries there is an airport departure tax.

Can I contact AmeriSpan directly?

It is always best to contact your child's group leader before contacting AmeriSpan. If you are unable to do so, do not hesitate to contact us. If you need to get a hold of your child while they are traveling, please call the AmeriSpan office or our 24 hour Emergency Phone number and we will help you get in touch with your child.

PLANNING TIPS

Start Early

To get a successful start, we recommend leaders begin planning 6-8 months before traveling. This gives both the group leaders and AmeriSpan time to get every detail perfect. This also allows participants and parents enough time to make decisions, apply for passports, and raise money for the trip.

Pick Your Dates

Try and choose dates that will fit into most people's schedule. Ask administrators, participants, and parents if there are dates that conflict with school activities, holidays, exams or other obligations that might hold back participants. If you find your dates will not work out, please inform AmeriSpan so we can help you plan for alternate dates.

Choose Location(s)

Location, Location, Location! This is what sells participants and parents. Make sure to choose a location that will appeal to broad spectrum of participants, but also will allow you as the leader to accomplish your trip objectives. If leading a younger group, keep in mind the safety concerns of parents as well.

Outline Objectives

Consider what you want to accomplish on this trip and what you want participants to gain. How can these goals be achieved? Consider how classes, activities, lodging, lectures, and excursions will impact your overall purpose. Think about who will participate and make sure the objectives are achievable within their limits.

Set Expectations

It is important that everyone involved have a clear set of realistic expectations for the program. As a leader, you must be realistic it what your participants can do in a given time. Be careful not too plan too much. Also, remember AmeriSpan has its limitations as well. We will work our best to get you what you want, but there are certain things beyond our control. Students must also understand what is expected from them. When language classes involved, students must be aware this is a serious academic program. They must attend classes on time and participate fully in classes and activities. There are more appropriate times to have fun with friends.

Identify Constraints

Take into consideration anything that could prevent the program from running, and running smoothly. Think of reasons why your school would not allow the program. What would hold back parents from signing up their children? Know how to quell fears and uncertainties that may come up. If there are organizational requirements, make certain they are included from the start. Also, take into account some participants and their families may have a budget.









PLANNING TIPS

Get Permission

Depending on where you work, you may need permission to organize a group travel program. Get permission before students become involved. Please let AmeriSpan know if there is any documentation that you must provide to your administration.

Estimate Participation

It is important to know how many students will participate in the program. If the group is going to be large, you may want to consider additional leaders or chaperones to assist you. You may need to set a limit to the number traveling. Also, some activities are better suited for groups of different sizes. Figure out what is manageable for your group.

Ask for a Quote

Contact AmeriSpan and ask us for a price quote. Be sure to include all the necessary information such as dates, location(s), lodging, age, participation, activities, and any special requests. The more AmeriSpan knows up front, the faster we will be able to prepare your quote. Keep in mind, that if your program is customized, it may take longer to complete the quote. To request a quote for your program fill out our Online Request Form.

Marketing Plan

Get the word out! Make sure as many people know about the program as possible. By creating a buzz, you will gain more interest. Hold an information session, both for participants and parents. Create marketing materials that have all the key information on them and are visually appealing. Pictures are the great way to capture interest. Use your resources wisely; display posters; put an advertisement in the school newspaper; write an article for the newsletter; hand out flyers after an event; talk at parent-teacher meetings; make constant announcements for all meetings; send emails. Make sure people have materials with all the important details such at the locations, dates, price, and deadlines.

Set Deadlines

Set deadlines and be firm. You will want to set the following deadlines:

- Application & deposit
- Final payment
- Last day to cancel with a refund.

Make deadline dates earlier than preferred and state that absolutely no exceptions are made. This will provide a sense of urgency to the undecided but will allow a few days of leeway for those who are late.

Application materials and payments

Be sure all interested participants have an application packet before the deadline. In order to register a group, AmeriSpan needs a completed application and required deposit for each participant. To ensure availability, it is preferred that AmeriSpan receive all applications at least 4 months prior to the program start date. It is best to send the registrations of all group participants at one time to avoid confusion. Final payment for the group is due 6-8 weeks before departure, or by regulation of the airline if AmeriSpan is arranging airfare.

IS LEADING A GROUP RIGHT FOR YOU?

Is Leading a Group a Right for You?

Leading a group is a rewarding experience, but it is just not right for everyone. Before you begin planning, you should consider things that would make it challenging for you. Before students and parents become involved, think about the following:

- Have you lead a group of students in the past?
- Have you traveled to this location before or do you know someone who has?
- Do you have the time to effectively organize this program?

Experience:

Have you traveled the to the city or country where you want to take your students? Whether you answered yes or no, you can still travel with your group. Just be sure to know as much as you can about the location. Identify sites and activities nearby. Consider safety and be prepared to handle questions. Ask colleagues, friends, and family about past experiences.

Organization:

For your trip to be a success, you must be organized. If you let things slip through the cracks, your group could suffer. If you think it is too much for just you, enlist a colleague or parent to help. You will have someone to share the workload and another person to travel with during the program.

Parents:

Parents need the most convincing. Show students some pictures and they are in! However, parents will have the tougher questions: safety, supervision, itinerary, teachers, payments, flights, etc. Know your plans and speak confidently.

Accountability:

Remember, you will be accountable for the students and the success of the program. The more you understand and the more you put into this, the higher the return you will receive abroad.

JOIN A GROUP

If you are planning on traveling as a group and would like to include participants from outside your school, organization, or circle of friends. AmeriSpan will post your program on our site and invite others to join! This is an excellent option for leaders who do not want their group to be too small or for those who want to expose their participants to a more diverse group. If you are planning studying with AmeriSpan, but do not feel like going alone, joining an existing group is for you.




CHINA: Beijing



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TEENAGER & VOLUNTEER

TEEN GROUPS

Group travel with teenagers can be overwhelming. One of the most important aspects is making sure you have the proper ratio of students to adults. Even all the planning in the world cannot help if there are too many kids to look after in another country.

If you are not sure you have enough teachers or parents to help supervise, consider taking your class on one of our pre-arranged summer Teenager Immersion Programs. These programs are designed to accept students as individuals or in groups. The daily classes and activities will already be planned and additional counselors will already be onsite.

Also, by joining a teen program, your students will have more opportunity to interact with the other teens onsite. In many of our camps and immersion programs, the student body has a great international mix and this will allow students to learn about people and cultures from all around the world, not just their host country.

Teen programs suitable for groups:

- Summer Camps These are specifically designed for teenagers at a special campus, separate from the campus for adults. Most camps have a special residence or dormitory where participants eat and sleep. The students will study and participate in activities here as well. Excursions off campus are arranged some evenings and on weekends. Normally, these programs have the most supervision.
- Junior Immersion Programs are designed for teenagers but the program may share facilities with the adult program. All classes are separate from adult classes. Housing and meals are with host families. The families are chosen based on their willingness to enforce a curfew and provide some supervision. These programs are highly supervised but transportation to and from school and any free time between dinner and curfew is unsupervised (unless the group chooses to add additional activities.)

VOLUNTEER GROUPS

Volunteer. Share your skills. Make a difference. Experience, learn and grow together Student and faculty members, community groups, and businesses often look for ways to study and experience culture while helping those who need it most. AmeriSpan has recognized this desire and has put together special group volunteer options. Groups can volunteer just a few days or everyday before or after class. Participants can also spend the their entire day volunteering at local organizations.

Options available for groups:

• Experiential/Part-time Volunteering

This option is for groups who would like to incorporate a service aspect into their program, but the focus is still on their language classes and cultural activities. This is also a good option for groups tight on time. It will allow students to experience many aspects of their host country in a short time. In this program, students would volunteer 1 to 3 times per week before or after language classes. Placements are available for all ages and language levels.

• Full-time Volunteer

Groups with extended time may consider a full time volunteer placement. Participants will begin volunteering full-time after they complete the desired weeks of classes. Students will be able to improve language skills and dedicate time to a local organization, while also participating in cultural activities. This program offers the full immersion experience.

• Volunteer Only (no required language classes)

Groups not interested in language study may also be eligible for volunteer placements. This means the group will volunteer without taking any classes. This is best for groups with more advanced language abilities or specialized skills.

Teenager <u>Favorites</u>

Spain Programs: 10 years ago, we began offering our teenager summer program in Marbella, Spain. Since then teenagers, (and their families) continue to flock to Spain in the summer. In 2010, we are offering summer camps in Barcelona, Madrid, Marbella, Salamanca and Valencia. Teens can also take advantage of our Junior Immersion programs in Granada and Sevilla. Programs fill up fast and lower airfares disappear quickly so don't delay!

Alajuela, Costa Rica: AmeriSpan's 1st ever teenager program! This long-standing program was chosen as an ideal teen location because of the safety and stability of Costa Rica, as well as being a relaxed, fun and well-supervised program. The school from the outset has been one of our top ranked Spanish schools, as they offer an extremely highly quality academic program.

La Manzanilla, Mexico: Relaxed, small town, owner-operated school with lots of personalized attention, beach and excursions makes this a popular program. One of the best aspects is the program for teenagers include a volunteer component where the participants can make a difference.

Program Highlight

Inspiring Community Center: Cordoba, Argentina

This project is a non-profit, non-governmental organization that provides several services and protection to that part of Cordoba's population that suffers from severe poverty. The main objective of the people who work in this project is to foster a sense of dignity, transmitting a feeling of self-assurance. Most of all, they want to provide the population of the neighborhood with tools and knowledge, so that they can improve their own situation. The complete program includes a food program, a small but skilled factory of pastas, a second-hand clothes shop, workshops and a day-care for about 70 children. Volunteers are welcome to help everywhere. Professionals are also welcome to set up new workshops that can help improve the professional skills of the clients.



HOW TO REGISTER

REGISTRATION AND PAYMENT

To insure a space in an AmeriSpan Group Program, it is important to register as far in advance from your desired start date as possible (especially for summer programs.) Registration consists of:

- 1. Group Programs without airfare: Submit a completed application and \$100 non-refundable deposit per person.
- 2. Group Programs with airfare: Submit a completed application and \$200 non-refundable deposit per person. The total cost for the program is due 6 weeks prior to the start date. Applications and full payments received less than six weeks prior to the start date will be subject to a \$35 late fee. All payments may be made with personal check, money order, VISA, Mastercard, American Express and Discover.

Important note: If AmeriSpan is arranging airfare for your group, the airfare portion of the final payment may be due 8-10 weeks in advance, depending on when you are registering. Late registrants may not be able to travel on the same flight or at the same price as participants who submit deposits on time.

REFUND POLICIES (excluding Alajuela, Costa Rica)

The deposit (\$100 or \$200) is non-refundable. You are entitled to a full refund (excluding the deposit) when you cancel more than 8 weeks before your start date. If you cancel within 4 to 8 weeks before the program start date, you will receive a refund (excluding registration fee) less a 25% penalty. If you cancel less than 4 weeks before the program starts, you will be entitled to no refund. You will be entitled to no refund after the program starts. If it was due to a personal emergency and you notify AmeriSpan in writing, we will review your claim and may issue a partial refund. Airfare arranged by AmeriSpan is non-refundable.

The above refund policy is exactly the same in cases of cancellation due to war, terrorism or similar cases. Programs can get canceled and/or changed; AmeriSpan is not responsible for these changes. AmeriSpan reserves the right to substitute comparable programs or refund tuition. AmeriSpan's liability is limited to all money paid for the program.

Classes canceled in honor of local holidays will not be made up and are not subject to any refund.

TRANSFERRING PROGRAM POLICIES

The deposit (\$100 or \$200) is non transferable. You may transfer your entire program fees paid (excluding the deposit) when transferring more than 8 weeks before your start date. If you transfer within 4 to 8 weeks before the program start date, you may transfer all fees paid (excluding registration fee) less a 25% penalty. If you transfer less than 4 weeks before the program starts, you may transfer all fees paid (excluding registration fee) less a 50% penalty.

DISCOUNTS & INCENTIVES

AmeriSpan's repeat customer discount and all other listed discounts and specials do not apply to Group Programs.

TRAVEL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

If you register at least 4 weeks prior to your start date, AmeriSpan will enroll you in a Travel Assistance Program, which includes Emergency Medical Evacuation services, Accident & Sickness medical expenses and other services. Your enrollment is for 6 months and will begin 2-3 weeks prior to your start date. AmeriSpan has information about purchasing additional travel/health insurance. Companions of students are not eligible for this travel assistance package. Coverage is limited to that outlined in the relevant policies. In no way is AmeriSpan responsible for providing any of the services offered through the policy. Depending on your preferences, additional insurance may be desired and is your responsibility. Neither AmeriSpan, the school, nor the host family are responsible for any part of any medical bills.

DEPOSITS & ON-SITE CHARGES

While participating in this program, you may be responsible for paying additional funds related to your own actions while on-site. Some schools will collect deposits upon your arrival while others will collect only if you incur these charges. Typical extra charges can include but are not limited to: lost keys, property damage, overstaying in your lodging, hosting overnight guests in your lodging, and lost books.

BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

Participants are expected to be courteous and respectful guests and to obey all local laws. Illegal drug use or abusive behavior at any age or alcoholic consumption by minors cannot be tolerated. AmeriSpan reserves the right to refuse to serve, to cancel and/or terminate participation for any person who fails to comply with the policies of the program provider (e.g. school, tour operator, program organizer), or for any other reason deemed necessary, in the sole discretion of AmeriSpan.

In the case of participants under the age of 18, use of alcoholic beverages and/or illegal drugs - at any age will not be tolerated. AmeriSpan reserves the right, without escort, and without refund, to send home any participant who does not conform to policy for alcoholic beverages and/or who uses illegal drugs. The return trip will be at the participant/family's own expense; no refund to be given.

LIABILITY

While participating in this program, you may be exposed to certain risks. These exposures include, but are not limited to accident and/or sickness without readily available medical facilities, the forces of nature, travel in the air, travel on the ground, terrorism, and war. TERMS & CONDITIONS

Registration and Payment

To insure a space at any AmeriSpan program, it is important to register as far in advance from your desired start date as possible (especially for summer programs). Group Programs (without airfare): To register submit a completed application and \$100 non-refundable deposit per person. Group Programs (with airfare): To register submit a completed application and \$200 non-refundable deposit per person. The total cost for the program is due 6 weeks prior to the start date. Applications and full payments received less than six weeks prior to the start date will be subject to a \$35 late fee. Important note: if we are arranging airfare for your group, the airfare portion of payment may be due 8-10 weeks in advance, depending on when you register. Late registrants may not be able to travel with or at the same price as participants who submit deposits on time.

Refund Policies

The \$100 deposit (\$200 if arranging airfare) is non-refundable. Cost of Program: You are entitled to a full refund (excluding the deposit and airfare cost) when vou cancel more than 8 weeks before your start date. If you cancel within 4 to 8 weeks before the program start date, you will receive a refund (excluding registration fee) less a 25% penalty. If you cancel less than 4 weeks before the program starts, you will be entitled to no refund. You will be entitled to no refund once the program begins. If it was due to a personal emergency and you notify AmeriSpan in writing, we will review your claim and may issue a partial refund. Airfare arranged by AmeriSpan is non-refundable.

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Classes canceled in honor of local holidays will not be made up and are not subject to any refund.

Refund Policy for Alajuela, Costa Rica

The deposit is non-refundable. If you cancel for any reason more than 4 weeks before your start date, you will receive a refund (excluding registration fee and airfare cost) less a 25% penalty. If you cancel less than 4 weeks before the program starts, you will be entitled to no refund. You will be entitled to no refund once the program begins.

Transferring Program Policies

The \$100 deposit (\$200 if arranging airfare) is non transferable. You may transfer your entire program fees paid (excluding the deposit) when transferring more than 8 weeks before your start date. If you transferred within 4 to 8 weeks before the program start date, you may transfer all fees paid (excluding registration fee) less a 25% penalty. If you transferred less than 4 weeks before the program starts, you may transfer all fees paid (excluding registration fee) less a 50% penalty.

Price

If the number of group participants changes, all program and airfare prices are subject to change.

Discounts & Incentives

AmeriSpan's repeat customer discount does not apply to Group or Special programs.

Travel Assistance Program

If you register at least 4 weeks prior to your start date, AmeriSpan will enroll you in a Travel Assistance Program, which includes Emergency Medical Evacuation services, Accident & Sickness medical expenses and other services. Your enrollment is for 6 months and will begin 2-3 weeks prior to your start date. AmeriSpan has information about purchasing additional travel/health insurance. Companions of students are not eligible for this travel assistance package. Coverage is limited to that outlined in the relevant policies. In no way is AmeriSpan responsible for providing any of the services offered through the policy. Depending on your preferences, additional insurance may be desired and is your responsibility. Neither AmeriSpan, the school nor the host family are responsible for any part of any medical bills.

Deposits & On-Site Charges

While participating in this program, you may be responsible for paying additional funds related to your own actions while on-site. Some schools will collect deposits upon your arrival while others will collect only if you incur these charges. Typical extra charges can include but are not limited to: lost keys, property damage, overstaying in your lodging, hosting overnight guests in your lodging, and lost books.
