#### WHO IS AMERISPAN?

AmeriSpan specializes in language immersion programs, academic study abroad, volunteer  $\delta$  internship placements and other educational travel experiences.

AmeriSpan started in 1993 in a small apartment with only one phone line and one computer. Since 1993, AmeriSpan has grown tremendously, sending more than 35,000 people abroad to participate in our programs. We are constantly working to improve our existing programs, add new programs and help you select a program that best fits your needs.

All of our programs are designed around the basic purpose of helping you understand and communicate in another language with different people in a pleasant and fast way. Our 'formula' for accomplishing this consists of three ingredients for your success: intensive language instruction, cultural immersion and leisure. Many programs such as our volunteer & internship and SALUD programs include a service learning component as well. With AmeriSpan, you have the opportunity of choosing between different countries, target languages, housing, lifestyles and methods of instruction from our various programs.

#### **Program Types**

AmeriSpan offers a variety of Professional Development Immersion programs which combine intensive language training with other specialized components. These additional components may include specific vocabulary classes, topical relevant courses, observational visits to relevant institutions, guest speakers, in-classroom practice and training, and in some cases, hands-on training. Each program is different and includes different components and may have specific language and/ or other requirements.

This catalog has been divided into three main areas: Medical Spanish or Portuguese; Business & Professional; and Teachers & Educators.

#### Medical Spanish & Portuguese

Our most popular professional program is the SALUD Medical Spanish program utilized by many members of AMSA (American Medical Student Association) and available to people studying or practicing in health-related fields. The program's primary goal is improving Spanish/Portuguese including relevant vocabulary. The secondary goal is to expose the participant to another country's healthcare system. Each program does this in different ways. Backgrounds of past participants include: traditional & osteopathic medical students, pre-med, nursing, pharmacology, and physical therapy students, physician assistants, nurses, paramedics, EMTs, and physicians. Many destinations in Latin America and Spain are offered and the SALUD program is available for Spanish or Portuguese learning.

#### Business & Professional

Business & Professional programs help prepare you to be more successful in today's global marketplace. The typical program in this sector includes general language courses, specialized vocabulary courses and some additional specialized courses. Our professional language programs offer specialized courses for a variety of occupations and provide the language skills that working professionals and business students need in day-to-day business dealings. Past participants come from a variety of working backgrounds and business degrees including flight attendants, corporate executives, self-employed business owners, journalists, engineers, lawyers, government & military personnel and even food purveyors.

#### Teachers & Educators

AmeriSpan offers a variety of language programs for current and future educators. Several different types of programs are offered. The most popular offering in this segment is our MAESTRO Spanish for Educators programs. Educator and Teacher programs are open to all educators, education majors, student teachers and school administrators who interact with limited English proficient (LEP) Spanish-speaking students and parents. In addition, we offer programs for foreign language teachers in 4 languages who want to update their teaching methodologies and language skills. We also offer Exam Prep Courses for those planning to take a national language certification exam.

#### Why Immersion?

Learning another language is more than memorizing vocabulary and grammatical structure; it's embracing an element which binds together a people ... a way of life ... a culture. You cannot learn these aspects from a book, experience is your only teacher. By totally immersing yourself, you will speed up your comprehension and usage of your target language because you will be living the language. Here are some other reasons to consider total immersion:

- Fewer Distractions & Better Concentration By leaving responsibilities such as job and family at home, focusing on language studies is more easy.
- Recreation & Relaxation Whether your interests lie in food, art, architecture, history, beaches, outdoor activities or something else, you can find an immersion program that will allow you to pursue those interests while you participate.
- Around-the-Clock Classroom Learning extends beyond the class hours because you are surrounded by the classroom. You will constantly be reading, speaking, and listening to the foreign language whether eating a meal, shopping, or asking for directions.

#### LODGING & MEALS

Most AmeriSpan programs include at least one type of lodging. They usually include meals and are intended for various age groups. For those interested in arranging their own lodging, we do offer classes only and may be able to offer a few hotel recommendations. Below are descriptions of the three types of lodging available at our different programs:

#### Host Family (some meals)

Nearly all AmeriSpan programs offer you the opportunity to live with a local host family. The families are screened and selected by the AmeriSpan partner school. In addition to receiving room and board, many students form friendships that can last a lifetime. Living with a family provides complete immersion, gives you the opportunity to practice what you've learned, and gives you a firsthand look at a different culture. According to our past participants, the homestay is either the best or worst part of the trip. The difference is in the expectations of our students. The students who have realistic expectations almost always believe the homestay was the best part of the trip. Those who have unrealistic expectations can be disappointed. Remember many of you are coming from one of the richer countries in the world. Few homestays will be equal to the comforts that you may take for granted.

#### Apartment or Residence (no meals)

At many programs, you have the option of staying at an apartment/school residence shared by other participants. Apartments/school residences vary by location, but generally, have a kitchen, a common room, and a washing machine. Normally, your bedroom is shared but may be upgraded to a private bedroom for an extra charge. Most or all of your housemates will be attending the same language program as you. No meals are included, and bathrooms are shared with your housemates.

#### Dorm (some meals)

AmeriSpan can arrange lodging at a dorm if listed as an option in our materials. Mainly in Europe, we offer the option of staying in a dorm shared with participants attending your program and/or local students attending universities. Dorms vary by location, but generally have a cafeteria where some meals are served and some common areas. In addition, many dorms are single sex and have rules regarding visitation, noise, etc. Normally, your bedroom is shared but may be upgraded to a private bedroom for an extra charge. Some meals are included with this option.

#### ACADEMIC CREDIT

If you wish to receive credit for AmeriSpan programs, you have 3 options:

#### Your Local University

Many times you can obtain credit for participation in an AmeriSpan program from your local university. This usually involves meeting with faculty from your Study Abroad or Foreign Language department. Sometimes your faculty will request a course syllabus or other information. Just let us know what information you need and we will be happy to assist you. Many of AmeriSpan's partner schools have agreements with colleges and universities, whereby participants can earn academic credit for their language study.

#### Brookhaven College

Brookhaven College is known as a comprehensive community college and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (www.sacscoc.org). Students have the opportunity to earn up to 17 credits for Beginner & Intermediate language levels in a variety of languages including Arabic, Chinese, French, Italian, Japanese and Spanish.

#### **CLEP Exams**

The College-Level Examination Program® (CLEP) gives you the opportunity to receive college credit for what you already know by earning qualifying scores on any of 34 examinations. Depending on your college's CLEP policy, a satisfactory score on a CLEP exam can earn you from 3 to 12 college credits. The best part is the cost of an exam is less than \$100!

# A Word About Expectations The majority of SALUD participants have

commented that this program changed their lives in some way. However, false and unrealistic expectations have the potential to ruin your experience.

#### You should expect...

- To improve and or acquire foreign language skills in Spanish or Portuguese.
- To be open minded about your experience.
- Some additional out of pocket expenses. Things like local transportation, going out in the evenings, etc. are not included in the program cost.
- To participate in cultural activities.
- To learn something about the medical system of the host country. This may be accomplished in a variety of ways, which include some or all of the following: site visits, special topic lectures, service learning, etc.
- To dress appropriately for site visits. Specific information will be included in your confirmation package after you enroll.
- To bring donations. See itinerary for details.



#### Do not expect...

- To be able to treat patients directly. Remember, you are not licensed in the host country. You may be able to do some basic hands-on work depending on your language level and medical skill level.
- The schedule to be set in stone. Opportunities may arise on-site to add something or change something on the original itinerary for the benefit of the participants or other reasons beyond control.
- This to be a relaxing vacation. The primary purpose of this program is to give you a lot of information in a relatively short amount of time. You will have some free time. If you are looking for a more relaxing program, try our Standard Immersion Programs, which are non-specific to medicine.

#### Overview

AmeriSpan's SALUD medical program dates back to the year 2000. At that time, an AMSA (American Medical Student Association) member from Ohio contacted us with a special request to design a short-term program geared for medical students. The leader wanted us to use our expertise in language immersion programs to incorporate Spanish language classes, cultural activities, excursions, and an overview of the medical system in Ecuador into one program.

Since that first program in Quito, over 1,000 healthcare students and professionals from 48 US States, 4 Canadian provinces and 6 other countries have participated. Backgrounds of past participants include: traditional & osteopathic medical students, pre-med, nursing, pharmacology, and physical therapy students, physician assistants, nurses, paramedics, EMTs, and physicians. Many additional destinations in Latin America and Spain have been added over time, and the SALUD program is now available for Spanish or for Portuguese.

#### Required Skills

Each SALUD program has been designed to accommodate participants of different language levels and different medical backgrounds. Consequently, not all programs are for everyone. The programs each have a required language level listed. If you do not meet the minimum level, you can still apply but should plan on signing up for at least an additional two weeks of language class prior to the start of the program. Additionally, due to the nature of the on-site medical component, some programs are restricted to higherlevel medical students or professionals while others are open to everyone. Please be sure you meet the minimum requirements before you apply and ask if you have any questions.

#### Elective Credit & CEUs

AmeriSpan SALUD participants have been able to receive academic credit or CEUs (Continuing Education Units) in two ways:

- Foreign language credit May be available through your own college or university, or through AmeriSpan's credit arrangement with Brookhaven or Seattle Central Community College.
- Medical elective credit Usually decided by your advisor. AmeriSpan can sign general elective forms from your school. You should bring evaluation forms to the in-country school staff to be completed during your course.

#### Three Different Types of SALUD Programs

- SALUD Group Program: This is our standard SALUD program. AmeriSpan has successfully offered these programs since the year 2000, they are designed for groups of 10-20 participants, and have set start dates in the spring and/or summer months. These programs not only give you the opportunity to learn the language and see first-hand the medical system of another country, but you will also meet healthcare students and professionals from other parts of the USA, Canada and elsewhere around the world.
- SALUD Independent Program: Offers the same core curriculum as the SALUD Group programs, however the Independent Programs offer the flexibility to start any Monday of the year. With the independent programs, you won't have the interaction with other SALUD students as you would in the Standard programs and may be the only SALUD student. You will still interact with non-SALUD students studying the language. Also, SALUD Independent programs may have fewer lectures and activities and are typically a bit more expensive than the SALUD Group programs.
- Custom SALUD Program: Several medical school groups over the years have asked us to design a slightly different program to meet their group's needs. Maybe they are looking for more emphasis on language, or a different destination. Custom SALUD programs are available for groups of 3 or more who have slightly different needs than what the Standard & Independent programs have to offer.

#### On-site Medical Component

In addition to participating in special topic lectures and medical terminology classes, past SALUD participants have visited, observed or assisted in dozens of healthcare sites in Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Chile, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Guatemala, Mexico, Panama, Peru, and Spain. These sites have included a variety of public and private hospitals, rural clinics, AIDS and other terminal illness care facilities, nursing homes, private practice offices and more.





# TUGUESE

#### ARGENTINA: Buenos Aires Independent: 4 or 8 weeks

Buenos Aires is a cosmopolitan city with European flair; considered to be "one of the world's great cities" by Lonely Planet. Learn about the medical system of one of the most developed countries in Latin America. This program includes all of the most popular features of SALUD programs, but keep in mind that Buenos Aires is extremely large. Your commute can be up to 1.5 hours, even with the spectacular public transportation. Host families are generally placed partway between the school and the placement to even out your commute. You may have the option to switch lodging in the  $3^{rd}$  week if your

placement is on the outskirts of the city.

#### ARGENTINA: Cordoba Independent: 4 or 8 weeks

At around one-tenth the size of Buenos Aires and its surrounding suburbs, Cordoba is Argentina's 2<sup>nd</sup> largest city. The city and suburbs of Cordoba has an entirely different character than its larger counterpart, and is virtually undiscovered by North American tourists. The SALUD program here is similar to the Full-time volunteer program with additional private classes to study medical terminology. Your classes will only last for 2 weeks, so we urge you to study on your own or add additional weeks if your level is not strong. The placement can be shortened from 8 weeks to 6 at a slightly reduced cost. Occasionally, SALUD-ers are placed outside of the city for the clinical portion.

#### BRAZIL: Maceio Group: 4 weeks

Maceio is the state capital of Alagoas and is best known for its tropical lagoons and beaches. Like many of the cities in the region, Maceio is mainly a sugar port and the area is one of the most diverse and least spoiled by tourism in the country. The cities beaches offer nightly festivals and rituals to observe. You likely won't be able to get an international flight direct to Maceio, but instead get a connection from Rio, Sao Paulo or Salvador. This program is our only non-Spanish SALUD program, so it does cover the most important areas that we generally offer. The itinerary offers even premed students the opportunity to shadow doctors. It is an excellent location in which to learn about tropical diseases.



#### CHILE: Santiago Independent: 2 weeks

Santiago is beautifully set in a wide plain with the backdrop of the Andes and lots of public gardens sprinkled throughout the city. About 4 million people live in this modern city full of skyscrapers and traffic. Santiago offers the comforts and cultural activities of a big city and is close to beaches, mountains and Chile's lake district. The Santiago, Chile Independent program is for two weeks and includes: 20 hours of Spanish classes per week (group classes); 14 hours of medical terminology classes (private classes); private room with host family; 2 meals daily; one weekend excursion; cultural activities, clinical observation at hospital or clinic.

Overview of Costa Rican Health Issues

The town of Alajuela is very close to the San Jose Airport, but the school itself is outside the town on a quaint tropical hillside. Each building on the campus holds 2–4 classrooms and is named for a different native Costa Rican plant. Many placements will be located towards San Jose, so you will either have a longer commute to school or you will move to a family who lives closer to the placement during the optional 5<sup>th</sup> week. All participants will be expected to behave in a very professional manner as this program is for serious students only.

The city offers the best access to Volcán Barva in the Parque Nacional Braulio Carillo. Some placements are right in town, while others are a short bus ride to San Jose. We can be very flexible with the Heredia medical program. Some may choose to shorten the classes, other will lengthen the placement. You even have a choice of residence or homestay, which isn't offered in most SALUD locations. It is great for students who want to customize!

#### DOMINICAN REPUBLIC: Santo Domingo: 2 weeks

Imagine yourself learning Spanish near the beach in the Caribbean, surrounded by palm trees and fresh sea air. 

# **EDUCATOR**

programs?

Educator programs are language immersion programs for teachers, educators and administrators who work with students speaking many languages.

The programs are split into three categories: **Educator and Teacher Programs**, Programs for Language Teachers, and **Exam Preparation Courses.** Each prepares participants to interact with their target audience, whether it is students, parents, faculty, or co-workers and bosses.

#### Requirements

Each program is designed with a specific goal in mind, causing each to have different requirements to participate.

- Educator and Teacher Programs are for school employees wishing to learn Spanish and culture to help them in their school and classrooms. These programs do not have a minimum language requirement; though AmeriSpan suggests you do not enter as a complete beginner. Some knowledge of Spanish will allow you to fully benefit from the program and its activities.
- Programs for Language Teachers were created for those who teach the program's target language to students. Because all activities, lectures, and classes will all be taught in the target language, participants are expected to have a working level of the language. The specific level varies by program, but ranges from Intermediate to Advanced level. Some programs will require that you send proof of your teaching qualifications, information regarding your current or most recent employer, and/or a telephone interview to verify your language level.
- The Yucatan Spanish Institute is open to anyone, not only educators, with an interest in Mexican and Mayan history and literature. Because this program is taught entirely in Spanish, it requires an advanced language level.
- Exam Preparation Courses are available at many levels beginning with high beginner and ending with full native-like proficiency. Each language sets its own tests and levels, so requirements will vary. Participants are responsible for registering for the accurate level exam.

#### Types of Educator Programs

Educators and Teachers: The Educator and Teacher Programs include AmeriSpan's signature program, the MAESTRO Spanish for Educators Program. They are all specifically designed for current and future educators who are looking to learn about the Spanish language and culture in order to facilitate effective communication between themselves and the growing community LEP (Limited English Proficient) students and parents. These programs offer a unique opportunity to learn about teacher-student and parent-teacher relationships as well as the education system in Latin America in the context of learning Spanish. Participants will be exposed to a variety of educational settings and will have the opportunity to meet with local teachers and administrators. These programs are open to all educators, regardless of current language level and teaching position.

Language Teachers: Offered in four languages, these programs are designed for non-native foreign language teachers wishing to advance their teaching techniques in an immersion program. Yucatan Spanish Institute: This special summer immersion program is a seminar course focusing on Mayan history, literature, and culture. The program also includes activities and lectures to help participants bring what they learned back into the classroom. Though not exclusively for teachers, the majority of participants in this program are educators and those interested in history.

Exam Preparation Courses: Many languages have an official exam certifying language proficiency. These exams are often recognized by companies, government organizations, and educational institutions and are beneficial in obtaining work or entrance into school in a non-English speaking country. AmeriSpan's preparation courses are available in 7 languages. They are designed to help students get ready for the test and are timed to conclude right before the exam.

#### **Earning Continuing Education Units**

Some of AmeriSpan's past participants have been able to receive Continuing Education Units for their participation in our Educator Programs. Because each state, district, and school has different regulations, we recommend that participants check directly with their state's department of education and a school district administrator to see if the program is eligible. #### Daily and Weekly Schedule






